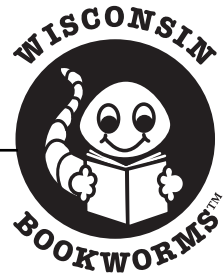

## Froggy Goes to School

“What will Froggy learn at school?”

Preschoolers are sure to relate to Froggy’s forgetfulness, impatience and fears. The repetitive text and funny sounds will encourage beginning readers, who will be attracted to the hilariously expressive illustrations.

**Before you read this book**, talk about “the first day of school.” What does that mean? How is school different from preschool, Head Start or home?

**While you read this book**, be sure to make the fun Froggy sounds...flop, flop, zip, zoop, zup...

Reading Tip: Make sure everyone can see the illustrations.

**After you read this book**, talk about other “firsts.”

First new tooth. First bike ride. First camping trip. Are these scary times? Are they fun?

Visit the school kindergarten. Talk to your kids about the school, a school bus (can you take a ride?) and recess. Help them meet the teachers.

At home, share stories about your own first day of school.
